I have not seen a director do this, but I have seen frustration and exasperation on their faces as they struggle to get the session going on time as we expect.

IMPROVE YOUR BRIDGE

Delay Drawing Trumps

It is common for inexperienced players to draw trump too soon before examining the whole hand. Recently at our Club this hand was played in 6 Hearts, and failed by 1 trick.

<u>West</u>	<u>East</u>
♠J2	♠A87653
♥AK9654	♥Q72
♦AK2	♦987
♣AK	♣Q

This is an excellent slam bid by the West hand, and declarer should pause to count the tricks before drawing trumps. There are 11 tricks on top, with 2 losers, a spade and diamond. There is no way to avoid a spade loser, but the diamond loser can be avoided. It is OK to draw 2 rounds of trump with the Queen and Ace, but the trumps are 3-1. Before drawing the last trump, play the Ace and King of Clubs, throwing a diamond from dummy. Then play the Ace and King of Diamonds and ruff your third diamond in dummy, so that you make 7 trump tricks.

Announcing a Void

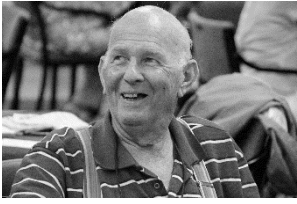
Many players insist on announcing that they are void in a suit. This is incorrect, and when defending, it is illegal. It is up to your partner to ask you whether you are void in that suit.
