BRIDGE TIPS - RESPONSES TO WEAK TWO BIDS

When partner opens a Weak Two it is important to agree on your response structure. I want to suggest that a new suit is *not forcing*. You can get back in your chair now! A

new suit has traditionally always been forcing in response to a Weak 2. Partner opens 2♥ and you hold:

<u> Hand #1</u>	<u> Hand #2</u>	Hand#3
♠ QJ10983	 A873	★ 43
7 7	v –	♥ 5
♦ Q109	♦ QJ109872	♦ Q52
♣ A63	♣ K2	♣ AKQ8762

If a new suit is forcing, you are handcuffed. You want to bid your own suit, but you don't want to force the auction. (Partner is likely to re-bid 3♥). Hence, you have to pass and let partner languish in 2♥. However, if a new suit is **not-forcing**, then you are sitting well. I believe your style regarding this should be based on the *frequency factor*. After Partner's opening of a Weak Two, you are more likely want to play in your own suit without forcing partner to bid again, than wanting to bid a new suit as forcing.

Other responses:

2NT: Asks for a feature (an Ace or a King) outside opener's suit. Opener simply bids the suit where she has the feature or returns to her first suit - I use 2NT for all forcing auctions. Having gone through 2NT first, if I then bid a new suit, then that is forcing! Hence, 2NT is the only forcing bid. Keeps it clean and simple.

Raise: Increase the pre-empt - 2♥ - 3♥. Opener must pass the 3♥. 3♥ is not inviting, it is just upping the ante. Game Raise: Shows a weak or strong hand. If weak, you must have four trumps!

An Aside: I like to keep my system simple, but the following responses (taught to me by a good friend) are helpful and can get you into some games and slams.

2♠ — 3♣* asks opener for a singleton (changes your bid on hand #3 above!)

3 ♦ — Singleton diamond

3♥ — Singleton heart

3NT — Singleton club

3♠ – No singleton

BRIDGE TOPIC OF THE MONTH

HESITATION

- 1. Hesitation is not an infraction in itself. An infraction occurs when their partner is influenced by the hesitation in the action they take.
- Hesitation generally reduces the options available to partner. They may not take any action that is suggested by the hesitation where other logical alternatives to that action exist.

INSUFFICIENT BIDS

- 1. It is never in a player's interest to:
 - a) alter an insufficient bid before the Director has advised them of their options.
 - b) announce to the table what they meant to write.
- 2. Many insufficient bids can be corrected without further redress once the Director has assessed the situation.


