PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With the hot and humid summer, we're experiencing, it is a real comfort to get inside the clubhouse when the conditions are so steamy outside, and the airconditioning has been running for long enough to get the temperature down to about 24° inside. It also pulls the humidity level down, so there's a double effect on your comfort. We've also been using the de-humidifiers so that we don't get another mould infestation. When I'm at the front desk, I often see people sigh with relief as they come into the building.

I'd like to draw your attention to the efforts of some committee members whose work has a low profile but still has a significant result for the club. We had a working bee in the outside area last year. Since then, a lot of the garden work has been continued by Tom France. He's been taking care of watering, planting, weeding, pruning and the occasional spot of mowing. Our surroundings wouldn't look as good without his continuous efforts. Another worker is Max Latimer, who has taken on the role of recycling manager. All the rubbish from our recycle bin in the clubhouse is sorted by Max, and he transports offsite all of the waste that can be put into that category. He also collects the cans and bottles that can be taken for the 10c return. For another example, a lot of the work associated with organising the catering has been done by Avra Bowler and her helpers. We had a lot of events in the last few months of last year - congresses, Inter-Club Teams, Melbourne Cup, Christmas party - and multiple overlapping catering arrangements had to be dealt with. I'd also like to thank all of the other people whose efforts allow us to keep operating smoothly.

The New Year Graded Pairs was held on two Tuesdays last month. We managed to attract 28 pairs, which is less than last year. We split the field into two grades with 7 tables each. The grades are done by ranking according to the total Master Points held by both players. There were just enough competitors to run a Swiss movement. See details on page 3.

We are in the process of setting up the Club Championship Teams event, which will be run on two Fridays in mid-February. At the time of writing, we have 10 teams nominated. More teams will always be better. If we have an even number, we can set up a round-robin event, so every team will play against every other one. With an odd number of teams, then a Whist movement is easy to run.

Supervised play has restarted and will continue until the end of March. We are getting 2 or 3 tables of people at these sessions. Beginning players are welcome to come and refresh their skills. I have a number of helpers in this task, and their input is greatly appreciated. The next set of lessons will start on the 2nd of April. If you have any family or friends who might like to learn, then ask them to get in touch.

The next AGM isn't too far away. We will soon be putting up nomination forms for committee positions and notices of motions to be voted on.

Principles of Opening Bid at One Level

Assuming you have the strength to open.

1. No Trump Opening

Whenever you can open

the bidding with 1NT do it! You show your strength and a balanced hand with one bid. Balanced hand means one of the following distributions:

a) 4-4-3-2 b) 4-3-3-3 c) 3-3-5-2

1 Two Five Card Suits

With two 5-card suits - bid your higher-ranking suit first, regardless of which suit has the most strength. This applies to opening bids and responses.

2 Powerhouse Hands

Whenever you have a hand with 23+ points or practically game in your own hand, you should open the bidding with 24. 24 is a forcing bid and cannot be passed.

3 Opening 1 ♦ With a three Card Suit

A 1 ◆ opening bid promises a <u>4-card suit</u>. There is only one exception: When you hold 4 spades, 4 hearts, 3 diamonds and 2 clubs. (4-4-3-2) *Then, and only then open 1 ◆!*

4 Two 3 Card Minors - Open 1.

With two 3-card minors and an opening hand that is not suitable to open with NT or a major suit, you should always open 1. This is regardless of suit strength.

5 Two Four Card Minors - Open 1♦

Whenever you hold two 4-card minors (not suitable for opening in no-trump) open **1**♦. Regardless of suit strength.

6 Rule of 20

With dodgy hands that lack high card points (less than 13 points) but are distributional, add the number of HCPs you have to the number of cards in your two longest suits. If it adds up to 20 - open the bidding. i.e. In the first hand below, the hand adds up to 20 with 10 HCP and two 5-card suits. In the second hand you have 10 HCP + 6 + 4 = 20. (6-card heart suit and a 4-card club suit).

- a) ♠ A J 9 7 3 ♥ 7 ♦ A J 10 7 3 ♣ 5 2 10HCP + 5 (spades) + 5 (diamonds) = 20 Open 1♠
- b) ★ 2 ▼ K Q J 10 9 7 ◆ 9 3 ♣ A 9 5 2 10HCP + 6 (hearts) + 4 (clubs) = 20 Open 1▼



Changes to System Regulations

In August this year, the ABF System Regulations were updated, and these changes are also reflected in the QBA System Regulations. The biggest change is to the definition of Green Systems which now state:

- a) All one-level opening bids are natural and non-forcing
- b) An opening bid of one of a major guarantees length (4+ cards) in the denomination named.
- c) 1NT should be balanced or semi-balanced

promise at least 8 HCP.

(Note: this does not preclude individual assessment of some hands, e.g. a hand with a singleton honour or a weak longer suit. The subsequent bidding methods however, should not be able to identify such hand types).

d) All one-level opening bids must, by agreement,

The previous version of this part of the System Regulations included:

b) An opening bid of one of a suit guarantees length (3+cards) in the denomination named (Exception: 4-4-3-2 and (4-3)-4-2 shaped hands may be opened 1+)

The removal of this clause and the exception clarifies matters well.

To be a green system, 1♣ and 1♦ openings must not be artificial (that definition of "artificial" has moved to Red systems) and must not be forcing. 1♥ or 1♠ show at least 4+ in the denomination named and must not be forcing.

A point of contention has been the "short club" or "very short club". If, in an otherwise standard system, 1 only promises 1+ or 2+ then it will still be a green system if responder will pass with less than (say) 6 points. If, instead, the partnership agreement is that responder "must call no matter what because opener might be short" (in clubs not stature) then the 1 bid has an additional meaning of being forcing and this then fails the Green test. Such a system will most likely fail the Blue test, and the system is classified as Red.
